

CEPSA QUÍMICA OBTAINS PLATINUM RATING FROM ECOVADIS

- **The Platinum rating is the highest recognition awarded by the sustainability evaluation agency EcoVadis.**
- **With this recognition, Cepsa Química is among the 1% of the best companies evaluated worldwide.**
- **Cepsa Química has achieved an overall score of 80 points out of 100.**

Cepsa Química, the world's leading producer of LAB and the second largest producer of phenol and acetone, has obtained a platinum rating from EcoVadis, the highest rating awarded by this global platform that evaluates the sustainability performance of companies worldwide. With this recognition, Cepsa Química is positioned within the top 1% of the world's most sustainable companies according to this rating.

In general, in all aspects evaluated by EcoVadis, Cepsa Química has shown an improvement in performance compared to the last rating. These results prove Cepsa Química's commitment to responsible management of its activity.

This year, Cepsa Química obtained an overall score of 80 points out of 100, which means an improvement of 5 points with respect to those obtained in 2023, and going from Gold to Platinum in just one year.

Particularly noteworthy among all the variables analysed are the results obtained in environmental matters, 90 out of 100; labour practices and human rights, with 80 out of 100; and sustainable procurement, also with 80 points. With this result, the company consolidates its position as one of the companies most committed to sustainability.

José María Solana, CEO of Cepsa Química, said: "We are extremely proud to have been awarded the Platinum rating by EcoVadis, a recognition that places us among the elite of the world's most sustainable companies. This achievement reflects the constant effort of the entire Cepsa Química's team to integrate sustainability into the core of our business, from our environmental practices to our supply chain management and human resource management.

The improvement in Cepsa Química's score compared to previous years and the achievement of the highest EcoVadis recognition by reaching the Platinum category represents, in the words of José María Solana, "proof of the continuous progress we are making at Cepsa Química and our firm commitment to sustainable and responsible management".

At the corporate level, the progress made in Cepsa's 2030 strategy has positioned the company in the top positions of the main international ESG rankings. Specifically, among the latest results obtained, Cepsa tops the S&P CSA rating in its sector; Moody's ESG ranking placed it among the three best companies for its performance and capacity for sustainable management in its sector in Europe; for the third consecutive year it is in first position in its sector worldwide for Sustainalytics and Clarity AI awarded it number 1 in its sector and placed it in the "leading category" for its impact on sustainability. The EcoVadis rating placed the company among the top 3% of companies in all sectors worldwide.

EcoVadis rates the sustainability performance of organizations in relation to four ESG areas: environment, labour practices and human rights, ethics and sustainable procurement. This platform is the most established international tool for rating the sustainability of companies, as it evaluates more than 50,000 companies worldwide and includes a wide range of criteria linked to sustainability management systems.

Cepsa is a leading international company committed to sustainable mobility and energy with a solid technical experience after more than 90 years of activity. The company also has a world-leading chemicals business with an increasingly sustainable activity.

Through its 2030 strategic plan, Positive Motion, Cepsa projects its ambition to be a leader in sustainable mobility, biofuels and green hydrogen in Spain and Portugal, and to become a benchmark in the energy transition. The company places customers at the center of its activity and will work with them to help them advance their decarbonization goals.

ESG criteria inspire all of Cepsa's actions to move towards its net positive target. Over the course of this decade it will reduce its Scope 1 and 2 CO₂ emissions by 55%, and the carbon intensity index of the energy products it markets by 15-20%, compared to 2019, with the aim of achieving net zero emissions by 2050.

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
